Show Rules

1. Any exhibitor can show that has not completed 12th grade and is a member of 4-H or FFA.
2. All goats and lambs must have an official up to date health certificate with signatures.
3. Market wether goats and does will be shown **together** and ewes and wether lambs will be shown **together**. Only 5 animals per species per exhibitor allowed. Show will be capped at the first 40 goats and first 40 lambs.
4. Each market goat or lamb entered must have a clean, readable scrapie ear tag in place. The tag must be in the animal before check in. All entries must include an ear tag number for all market goats/lambs on the entry form.
5. **NEW!!!** Lamb entries will be broken down into 3 different classifications. There must be a minimum of 5 lambs registered to make a classification. If there are not enough lambs to make a classification, lambs will be placed in the classification that contains the highest number of entries.

Classifications are....

Hair – This includes hair breeds like Katahdin, Dorper, and their crosses.

White/Speckled face – This includes white face breeds and their crosses with predominately white faces and dark speckles.

Black/Natural face – This includes breeds such as Hampshire, Suffolk, and their crosses.

6. All entries must be made through the show portal, no paper entries this year.
7. There will be no re-weighs after the goats/lambs leave the scale area.

8. The barn will be open on Wednesday, September 27th, for those wishing to unload early at the fairgrounds during the day; the grounds will open at 1:00 pm. Check in will be from 3:30pm – 5:00 pm, Wednesday, September 27th. Please have health papers ready.
9. Goat Showmanship will begin at 6:00 pm on Wednesday, September 28th. Showmanship order will be youngest to oldest.
10. Class break-downs will depend on the number of entries. Showmanship will start with the youngest exhibitors and continue by age until the final class. The goat market classes will begin following showmanship and then followed by the lamb show.
11. Penning will be a minimum of two animals per pen unless there is a single entry.
12. Animals must pen in the barn.
13. The Madison County FFA/4-H Goat/Lamb Committee, Madison County FFA/4-H, Madison County FFA Alumni, Madison County Young Farmers, Madison County Fair, Comer Lions Club or any associated agency nor any of its affiliates accepts no responsibility nor assumes any risk for injury to the exhibitor or animal due to or resulting from participation in the Madison County Fair Goat/Lamb Show.
